

4.5.6. Agreement 2 between Heinrich Beck and General Electric (7.5.1921)

For and in consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other valuable consideration, paid by Heinrich Beck, of Meiningen, Germany, to General Electric Company, a New York corporation, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the General Electric Company agrees:

1. To place on the nameplate of all searchlights embodying the inventions of either or both U. S. patents granted to Heinrich Beck, No. 1,029,787, and No. 1,086,311, built by or in behalf of the General Electric Company, the words "Beck System" in prominent letters, and also to use the said words "Beck System" in all publications offering such apparatus for sale.

2. To pay and herewith pays to the said Heinrich Beck, the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) in full remuneration for the past use in the works of the General Electric Company, of the model searchlight which said Beck brought to this country in July, 1914. The said searchlight is now held by the Alien Property Custodian at the works of the General Electric Company at Schenectady, N. Y., in immediate charge of the Inspector of Engineering Material, U.S.N. and the General Electric Company agrees that on presentation to it of the release of said searchlight by the Alien Property Custodian in writing, it will, at its own expense, securely pack the said searchlight for export and place the same at the disposal of Heinrich Beck or his accredited representative.
